

Conflict of Interest Code  
of the

**GOLDEN VALLEY MUNICIPAL WATER DISTRICT**

Incorporation of FPPC Regulation 18730 (2 California Code of Regulations, Section 18730) by Reference

The Political Reform Act (Government Code Section 81000, *et seq.*) requires state and local government agencies to adopt and promulgate conflict of interest codes. The Fair Political Practices Commission has adopted a regulation (2 Cal. Code of Regs. 18730), which contains the terms of a standard conflict of interest code. After public notice and hearing, it may be amended by the Fair Political Practices Commission to conform to amendments in the Political Reform Act. Therefore, the terms of 2 California Code of Regulations Section 18730, and any amendments to it duly adopted by the Fair Political Practices Commission, are hereby incorporated into the conflict of interest code of this agency by reference. This regulation and the attached Appendices (or Exhibits) designating officials and employees and establishing economic disclosure categories shall constitute the conflict of interest code of this agency.

Place of Filing of Statements of Economic Interests

All officials and employees required to submit a statement of economic interests shall file their statements with the agency head; or his or her designee. The agency shall make and retain a copy of all statements filed by its Board Members, Governing Board Members, Alternate Board Members, as appropriate, and its agency head (Agency/Department Head, Executive Officer or Chief Executive Officer, Superintendent, or Director), and forward the originals of such statement to the Executive Office of the Board of Supervisors of Los Angeles County.

The agency shall retain the originals of statements for all other Designated Positions named in the agency's conflict of interest code. All retained statements, original or copied, shall be available for public inspection and reproduction (Gov. Code Section 81008).

### **EXHIBIT "A"**

Persons in this category shall disclose the following types of investments, income, business positions and real property:

1. Real property within jurisdiction of the district
2. Real estate development
3. Construction and building materials
4. Engineering, surveying, architectural, and appraising
5. Soils testing, analysis, and compaction
6. Pipes, valves, pumps, motors, meters or other water system materials, parts or equipment
7. Chlorine, alum, lime, copper or other water system chemicals and supplies
8. Office equipment and supplies
9. Computer hardware, software and computer services
10. Water quality testing, equipment supplies and service
11. Motor vehicles, construction equipment, parts and service
12. Equipment rental
13. Petroleum products
14. Safety equipment and supplies
15. Newspapers, printing and reproduction services
16. Banks and savings and loans
17. Title insurance and escrow
18. Financial audit services
19. Insurance, including brokers and agencies
20. Employment and manpower agencies
21. Farming, including management, marketing, pesticide, and irrigation services
22. Recreation and park equipment and services
23. Electrical, electrical generating equipment and supplies
24. Well drilling services, equipment and supplies
25. Environmental services
26. Individuals who perform under contract the duties of any designated position shall be required to file Statements of Economic Interests disclosing reportable interests in the categories assigned to that designated position.

In addition, individuals who, under contract, participate in decisions which affect financial interests by providing information, advice, recommendation or counsel to the agency which could affect financial interests shall be required to file Statements of Economic Interests, unless they fall within the Political Reform Act' exceptions to the definition of consultant. The level of disclosure shall be as determined by the executive officer (or head) of the agency.

The Secretary may determine, in writing, that a particular consultant is hired to perform a range of duties that are limited in a scope and thus is not required to comply with the disclosure requirements described in these categories. Such determination shall include a description of the consultant's duties and based upon that description, a statement of the extent of disclosure requirements. Nothing herein excuses such consultant from any other provision of this Conflict of Interest Code.
